With the grit and grim of a he-man action film, this story moves at a rapid pace through a nightmarish world few will ever see. Late-night Hollywood Boulevard sets the scene for this couple's attempt to save a young woman's life.

These natives of the Milwaukee-Chicago area approach the sordid streets with unusual courage and cynicism, typical of their Midwestern background. Blood-filled photographs, homicides, and the morgue create a sinister backdrop for the iridescent into the criminal element of Los Angeles. Devlin Shore is the lethal man they plan to take out. Wired and ready for battle, Bailey is the plant. She puts her own life at stake in a precarious deception. If found out she won't live to see the next day. Tension and danger are a powerful aphrodisiac... falling in love they hadn't planned. Their feelings for each other make the success of their endeavor just as important as the rescue.
